1. Documentation of Teaching Activities and Effectiveness

1.1 Teaching Evaluations

Teaching evaluations are based on the Louisiana State University College of Agriculture Student Perception of Teaching (SPOT) Evaluation, adopted from the Evaluation and Examination Service of the University of Iowa. Teachers in the College of Agriculture (COA) are evaluated in every class through administration of the SPOT evaluation instrument. In the Department of Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness, these evaluations are used for both teaching improvement and as an input for promotion and tenure decisions. The SPOT contains a total of 20 questions, scaled from 1 to 5, with 5 being the best. The faculty in the College of Agriculture are required to include five standardized questions allowing for comparisons across the College. The other 15 questions allow comparison of the instructor with departmental scores, as well as providing a time series for analysis of an individual. Students are encouraged to provide written comments to the instructor.
